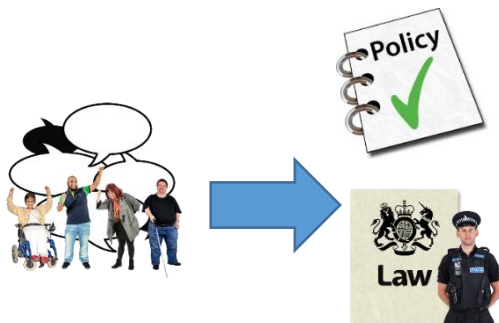

Working with the Scottish Parliament



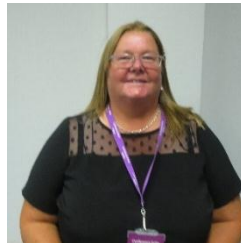
MACS will continue to give Scottish Ministers advice on:
